Bill Nye tried to make the point often, that if you believe in the creation model, you can't be a scientist. He said, "For the United States to maintain its leadership in technology, we need welleducated science students. To allow our students to come of age without the knowledge gained through the extraordinary scientific insights and diligence of our ancestors would deprive them of understanding of nature and our place in the cosmos. It would also rob our students of their future. Without scientists

Scripture tells us, "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was formless and void, and darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was moving over the surface of the waters. We live in a, materialistic, naturalistic world in which some have devised a way to take God out of the equation of how this world came into existence and life began upon it and many have <u>chosen</u> to believe that it better describes our existence. I simply do not agree.

I do agree though that what you believe about creation is not as important as what you believe about Jesus. Salvation does not turn on creation but on the fact that Jesus came into a sin stained world, lived a sinless life, died on the cross for our sin, rose from the dead, ascended back into heaven, sits on the right hand of the Father, interceding for us and will come again in power. Trust in Jesus will change your eternal destiny and change your world view.
